




VCU ORCID Email Domain Count by Month

VCU ORCID Adoption ETDs






2018 VCU Ithaka Faculty Study

- Administered Fall 2018
- Comparative data with 2018 national survey
- 538 completed VCU faculty surveys (15% response)
- Insights into researchers and role of libraries
- Selected preliminary results follow




% Very valuable. How valuable do you find support from your college or university library for each of the following aspects of the publication process, or how valuable would you find it if this support was offered to you?






% Not at all valuable. How valuable do you find support from your college or university library for each of the following aspects of the publication process, or how valuable would you find it if this support was offered to you?


Controlling journal costs

Universities, governments, and grant funders pay 3x:

- Faculty authors to conduct research and draft papers, transferred gratis to publishers
- Faculty editors who volunteer their time to peer-review and edit journal submissions
- Publishers for access to the final, published articles...
 ...Upon which career advancement depends




Consolidation in the publishing industry






Expansion into research process









The Result: Huge profit margins

- Pharmaceuticals (Pfizer): 42%
- RELIX (Elsevier): 39%
- Apple: 37%
- Taylor & Francis: 36%
- Springer-Nature: 35%
- Banking (Industrial & Commercial Bank of China): 29%
- Wiley: 28%
- Automotive (Hyundai): 10%

- VCU \$2,000,411 annual

- January 2020: VIVA statewide Wiley contract (with open access fund)
- December 2021: Elsevier journal contract
- Serious attention of Virginia research library directors and deans (<u>UC Elsevier</u> | <u>MIT Framework</u>)


